

# 2025 Spring/Fall Plant List Tree Choices

**\*Due to tree availability please note 1st choice and 2nd choices**

**\*Fall choice cut off February 15th \* Following Spring choice cut off August 15th\***

<b>American Beech</b> <i>Fagus grandifolia</i> (Spring Plant Only)	50-70 feet. Slow to medium growth rate. Bright green in spring and golden bronze in the fall. They have long branches that create a large, dense canopy.
<b>Black Gum</b> <i>Nyssa Sylvatica</i> <i>Catalpa speciosa</i>	30-40 feet. Slow growing. Dark green glossy leaves with scarlet red fall color. Dark, blocky bark and unique branching patterns provide winter interest. open structure. White flower clusters in spring.
<b>Princeton Elm</b> <i>Ulmus Americana</i>	50-60 feet. Dense, vase shaped growth habit with dark green leaves and yellow fall foliage. Dutch Elm Disease Tolerant.
<b>Jefferson Elm</b> [Improved Princeton Elm]	50-60 feet. Upright & vase-shaped, with green leaves that turn yellow in the fall. Dutch Elm Disease Tolerant.
<b>American Hornbeam</b> <i>Carpinus caroliniana</i>	20-25 feet. Dark green leaves turn yellow, to orange-red in fall. Oval in shape, and an Eastern U.S. Native tree.
<b>European Hornbeam</b> <i>Carpinus betulus</i>	30-35 feet. Dense tree with a columnar growth habit. Dark green leaves turn yellow in fall.
<b>Kentucky Coffeetree</b> <i>Gymnocladus dioica</i>	60-70 feet. Upright, vase shaped habit with green leaves. Extremely tolerant of adverse conditions.
<b>Autumn Brilliance Serviceberry</b> <i>Amelanchier x Grandiflora</i>	15-20 feet. White flower clusters in spring, green summer foliage and bright red fall color. Upright growth habit
<b>Tulip Tree</b> <i>Amelanchier Canadensis</i>	50-60 feet. Uniquely shaped leaves that are medium green, turning to bright yellow in white flowers that give way to small green berries.
<b>Red Bud</b> <i>Cercis Canadensis</i>	20-30 feet. Heart shaped leaves 3-5 inches. Flowers are light to dark magenta pink.
<b>Serviceberry</b> <i>Amelanchier canadensis</i>	15-30 feet. Medium to dark leaves that change to orange-red in autumn. Slightly fragrant white flowers that give way to small green berries.
<b>Amur Maackia</b> <i>Maackia amurensis</i>	20-30 feet. Clusters of white pea like flowers appear in late spring. Small shade tree. Grows slow to moderate. Silver-gray leaves when unfolding turning dark green.
<b>Japanese Lilac</b> 'Ivory Silk-Amur Lilac'	Up to 30 ft. in height. White fragrant flowers bloom in early summer. Medium to dark green leaves.
<b>Pin Oak</b> <i>Quercus palustris</i>	60-70 ft. Grows quickly. Provides shades of russet, bronze, and red in fall. Offers dense shade.
<b>Ginkgo</b> <i>Ginkgo biloba</i>	50-80 ft. Hardy, pest-resistant, and attractive large tree. Has unusual fan-shaped leaves that turn vivid yellow in fall.
<b>Cleveland Select Pear</b> <i>Pyrus calleryana</i>	20-30 ft. Moderate growth rate. Dark green leaves with white spring flowers and warm fall hues.
