Public Education Fire Truck School Visit Guidelines

Sterling Heights Fire Department is excited to offer a fire safety presentation for your classroom! To ensure everything runs smoothly, we ask that you follow these simple guidelines:

- Please make sure all teachers stay in the classroom continually monitoring the students.
- Teachers should be actively engaged and their attention on the students minimizing social media usage during the presentation to ensure a productive learning environment.
- Avoid exceeding the number of students you initially requested for the visit. **40 students per classroom.**
- Our fire crew may be handling an emergency during your requested time, so there's a chance they might arrive a bit late. If that happens, we ask for your patience as we make sure they get there safely.
- If an emergency call comes in during the presentation, the crew may need to leave suddenly. We appreciate your understanding as they attend to their duty.
- If the crew can't make it to your classroom due to an emergency, please feel free to request a new date, and we'll do our best to accommodate you.
- If your students have sensory sensitivities, please let the fire officer know ahead of time so we can avoid using lights or sirens.

Lastly, if the classroom lacks adult supervision or student oversight the fire officer may choose to leave and have the school reschedule the event.
