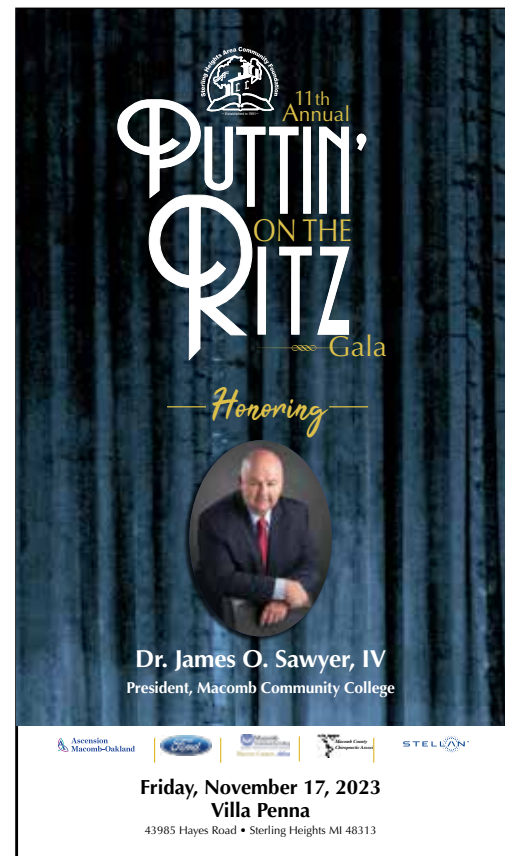

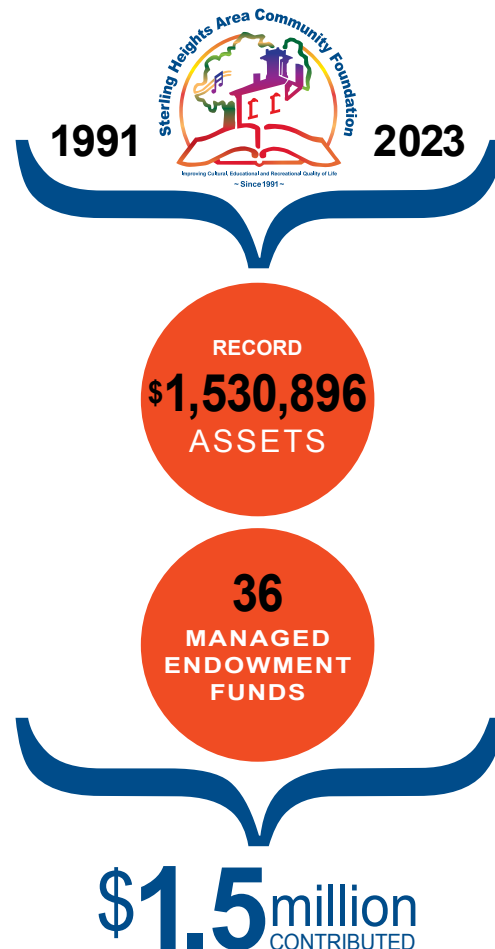

We are proud to celebrate our 33rd year of helping improve the quality of life of Sterling Heights area residents by enhancing cultural, educational and recreational opportunities in the community.

Year end assets totaled \$1,530,896, after 2023 grant disbursements totaling \$64,500 for a variety of activities supporting the Foundation's mission. Managed endowment funds grew to 36. Since its inception in 1991, the Foundation has contributed more than \$1.5 million to organizations and activities that support its mission.

In 2023, the Foundation supported many community efforts with financial grants and conducted a variety of activities to generate funds for future use in improving the quality of life of area residents.


