COnce again this year, we celebrate a period of rapid growth not only in relation to the philanthropic mission of the foundation but also in terms of its directors.

The volunteer board of directors works diligently to further enhance the quality of life in our community by supporting projects that directly benefit area residents. This year, we thank Sharon Arend of Ilitch Holdings and Kevin Chandler of Macomb Community College for their service as directors. As they continue to serve in their careers, we wish them the greatest of successes. We also welcome two new board members this year! Rob Aquilina of Walmart and Douglas Glazier of Henry Ford Macomb Hospitals will be joining us and sharing their visions for engaging community projects.

A safe community is of utmost importance to residents, and in 2014 the foundation was proud to partner with Ford Motor Company and UAW Local 2280 to provide over 1,000 Child ID Kits to elementary students in Warren Consolidated Schools and to families who utilize the Play Place for Autistic Children. The kits allow parents to create a profile of information for a child with defining characteristics, a photo, and inkless fingerprints. Should the need arise, the kits can be provided to law enforcement to aid in the search for a missing child.

The foundation also renewed its sponsorship of Sterlingfest in 2014 and expanded it to include the opening night's Beach Ball Toss! A new tradition of fun, directors attended and bumped beach balls to the crowd as they prepared to launch them into the air to kick off the festivities. We look forward to this evening once again this July!

Last May, the foundation was also pleased to award 36 college scholarships totaling \$29,500 to area students exhibiting excellence in a variety of upcoming fields with the generous support of our scholarship partners: BAE Systems, Chrysler Foundation (FCA), Ford Motor Company, General Dynamics Land Systems, Macomb County Chiropractic Association, Mayor Richard J. Notte, Rotary Club of Sterling Heights, Selfridge ANG Base Community Council, and Utica Community Schools Alumni. We also look forward to the 2015 scholarship program which has continued to grow. Join us in May as we award 40 scholarships totaling \$35,000 to deserving local students.



I proudly report that the Sterling Heights Community Foundation grew its asset base very significantly in 2014 while fulfilling its mission to improve the cultural, educational and recreational opportunities for Sterling Heights residents.

Assets reached an all-time high of \$689,900 and managed endowment funds grew to 21. Since its inception in 1991, the Foundation has contributed more than \$1.1 million to organizations and activities that support its mission.

In 2014, the foundation supported many community efforts with financial grants and conducted a variety of activities to generate funds for future disbursement to improve the quality of life of area residents.

Some key 2014 initiatives included:

Grants

- 38 scholarships totaling \$29,500 were awarded to area high school seniors for their pursuit of a college degree or vocational training
- Grew the 2015 Scholarship Program to 40 scholarships totaling \$35,000

- Held the second annual "Puttin on the Ritz" community gala where more than 225 attendees honored Macomb County's defense industry and its military veterans
